

A Last Word from Henry Morris

As readers of *Acts & Facts* know, ICR's Founder and former President, Dr. Henry Morris, passed into glory on February 25, 2006. His time of debilitation was rather short, only about three weeks long.

But even on his deathbed he was reluc-

tant to put down his pen. It had authored scores of thoughtful books and hundreds of insightful articles. His last endeavor was to write a summary of creation evidences, exposing the weaknesses and harmful impact of evolution thinking. He had written extensively on related subjects before, but here he condensed his thoughts into a short book, without weighty scientific language which could be easily read and understood by all.

It starts with the error

of evolutionary thinking. There is no true scientific evidence that macro-evolution is taking place, has ever taken place, or could take place. It certainly can't explain the exquisite design we see in living things. To believe in evolution one must *believe* in evolution. It is a faith without supporting evidence. Creation's view of history makes sense of the present evidence. But ideas have consequences, and the idea of evolution has had dire conse-

creation, both Biblical and scientific.

Next, it deals with the truthfulness of

quences. The destructive political and moral thought systems of our world are all built on an evolutionary foundation. Furthermore, evolution is the anti-Christian worldview, which stands in opposition to the Christian faith.

Actually, he had begun the work shortly before his hospitalization. In the hospital, even on his final day, he was proofreading the typed draft. Unable to hold his pen, he asked that it be fi-

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Accelerated Nuclear Decay


In this article, Dr. Eugene Chaffin, one of the RATE team members, answers questions about accelerated nuclear decay raised at the RATE conference in San Diego on November 5, 2005, by the audience.

Can you talk a bit about the theoretical support for accelerated decay?

In the field of theoretical physics, these last five years or so, many technical papers have been published testing, discussing, or modeling whether or not physical constants could have been different in the past. As physicists have realized, there are various observational facts that constrain whether these so-called constants may have varied over time. However, the data that provide these constraints do not always rule out meaningful changes. For example, in the case of the strong nuclear force, a change would possibly affect other values such as the size of the nucleus. The nuclear size may be compared to a baseball at the center of a major league ball park. Most of the atom is empty space. Slightly changing the size of the baseball (nucleus) will not change the size of the ball park (atom). Hence, the chemistry of life, such as the ability of DNA to replicate, will not be appreciably affected by changes in the nucleus. On the other hand, the rate at which nuclear decay occurs (analogous to the argument about whether the baseball is livelier today) may be drastically affected. In the RATE research, we have thus not really considered anything outlandish, compared to these modern technical papers on variable constants. However, we have considered radiohalos, helium diffusion, etc., as providing constraints on the sizes of the variations.

Does RATE have any proposed mechanisms within nuclei for accelerated nuclear decay?

Within nuclei, a small change in the strength of the nuclear force can lead to a change in the number of nodes in an alpha particle wavefunction and, consequently, the decay rate. For example, by making slight changes in the potential well depth (one measure of the nuclear force) as shown in the figure below the number of nodes in the wavefunction

changed abruptly and the decay constant varied greatly. A wavefunction is a quantity which determines where the alpha particle is likely to be found. According to quantum mechanics, it is a wave similar to those in strings or ropes. A loosely clamped string can allow waves to be transmitted past the clamp. In quantum mechanics, the wavefunction of an alpha particle can be non-zero even outside the nucleus. The nuclear force is not infinitely strong, just as the clamp on the string may not be infinitely strong. This allows the wave to exist past the clamp. Since the alpha particle wavefunction is not zero outside a nucleus, quantum wavefunctions allow a calculation of the concentration of alpha particles there and, thus, the nuclear decay rate. The decay rate can be many orders of magnitude larger for certain changed conditions of nuclear force.

The RATE project resulted in several significant findings, two books, and a DVD. It ended in December of 2005. However, RATE II was begun in January of 2006 under the leadership of Dr. Andrew Snelling. The new program will pursue a few new experiments and complete additional sampling for several of the old experiments. 

Dr. Henry Morris was a gifted scientist, educator, and Biblical apologist who pioneered the creation science movement over 45 years ago. But he also wanted to reach leaders in every field with a comprehensive understanding of the Bible's accuracy and authority.

In keeping with that broader vision, ICR's board of directors formally approved the establishment of the *Henry M. Morris Center for Christian Leadership* in Dallas, Texas. Officially launched in September, this new center is a ministry outreach directed toward men and women who desire to develop and demonstrate a thoroughly Biblical worldview within the context of their roles as leaders. Professionals in science, business, medicine, law, education, ministry, and government service have unique opportunities each day to influence and mentor those in their charge. The Dallas Center will establish a coalition of creationist organizations in higher education, develop distance education courses, expand conference and seminar ministries, and conduct leadership programs for specific professions.

This project is designed to train leaders in a creationist worldview, providing marketplace professionals with lay ministry tools, and equipping church leaders with practical helps designed to assist them in equipping the saints, implementing the salt and light principle (Matthew 5:13–16).

In the coming months, look for updates from the Dallas center as ICR implements Dr. Morris's far-reaching vision for leadership training and seeks to transform our culture for Christ.
